St. John Paul II Mission church opens with Mass, blessing ceremony

The Catholic Diocese of St. Augustine formally opened the St. John Paul II Mission church June 23, celebrating Mass and holding a blessing ceremony in the newly constructed parish center in Nocatee.

The new center was filled to capacity with local residents attending the Mass, which was celebrated by Bishop Felipe J. Estévez with Msgr. Keith Brennan and Rev. Ed Shaner serving as concelebrants.

"This is the day the Lord has made - finally," Estévez said with a smile. "After four years, you feel at home. Let us really celebrate and rejoice because you have built a house of God."

Estévez likened the addition of the church to the Nocatee community with the arrival of a new family to a close-knit neighborhood.

"Just as you would say, 'Those are the McCarthys, there live the Lynches, now you can say, 'This is a house of God," he said. "Let us celebrate today this community of faith. With the founding of St. John Paul II, you now have a complete place to encounter God and receive His mercy."

Located at 127 Stonemason Way in Nocatee, the parish center will serve as a worship space until the mission can afford to build a church. The 12,000 square-foot space offers seating for 450 as well as administrative offices, conference rooms, a stage, chapel and commercial kitchen.

St. John Paul II is a mission of Our Lady Star of the Sea Catholic Church in Ponte Vedra Beach under the leadership of Msgr. Brennan. Daily Mass will be celebrated at the parish center Monday through Friday at 8:30 a.m.; and Saturday at 5 p.m., with confession at 4 p.m. Sunday Mass will be celebrated at 8:30 a.m. and 10:30 a.m.



Ponte Vedra man found murdered in home

Adult son suspected in father's death, wife found dead next day in double suicide

A 70-year-old Ponte Vedra man was found murdered in his home June 22, setting off a manhunt that would end the following morning at a Daytona Beach motel, where authorities found the bodies of the victim's son and daughter-in-law.

Deputies had been seeking Joseph

Carmichael Reddock Jr., 41, in connection with the murder of his father. Joseph Reddock Sr., 70, was found by sheriff's deputies in the bedroom of his Sawmill Lakes home after the authorities received a request to attempt to contact him. The discovery set off a search for Reddock's son, who had a long criminal record and was believed to have been driving his father's car.

Authorities issued an alert for a 1999 Silver Honda with a faded hood and Florida plate number 635RHY. Reddock Jr. was believed to have been traveling with his new wife, Samantha. After crime scene technicians began examining the Sawmill Lakes home, officials issued an arrest warrant for second degree murder and possession of ammunition by a convicted felon for Reddock Jr.

On June 23, Daytona Beach police conducting a narcotics investigation discovered the victim's car parked near the Regency Motel on North Ridgewood Ave. in Daytona Beach. After noting that the suspect was

believed to armed and dangerous, police evacuated several nearby motel rooms and businesses, and requested assistance from the Volusia County Sheriff's Office SWAT team. The bomb squad and a robot were also brought to the scene. After the robot entered the room, the authorities found Reddock dead on the bed, while his wife, also deceased, was found on the floor. Several weapons were also found in the room.

Authorities later announced that notes from Reddock and his wife were found at the home and motel.

A history of violence

The St. Johns County Sheriff's Office inmate database indicates Joseph Reddock Jr. had been arrested numerous times on various domestic assault and battery-related charges since 2000. His father had also taken out two domestic violence injunctions against him.

But while Joseph Reddock Jr. had a lengthy criminal record, his wife's background appears far different. Following last week's events, friends and colleagues of Samantha Reddock said her life had undergone a drastic change in recent years, as the longtime accountant left her husband and son and became involved with Reddock Jr.

"We have lost a dear friend and valued colleague," her former employer, the United Way, posted on its Facebook page. "Samantha Reddock was our accountant for nearly 20 years and she will be missed dearly. Our hearts go out to her friends and family at this time."

According to Samantha Reddock's Facebook page, the couple had only just married on June 8, one week after the death of Joseph Reddock Jr.'s mother, Lynda Reddock. Posts on the page indicate a volatile relationship, with Reddock Jr. posting comments frantically trying to locate Samantha just days before their wedding.

"The second chapter is definitely better," Samantha Reddock wrote on the page, "especially when you spend it with the love of your life."

Rubio to seek re-election to Senate after all

DeSantis now to seek re-election to Congress

Reversing his pledge to return to private life if he did not win the Republican presidential nomination, U.S. Sen. Marco Rubio announced last week that he will in fact run for re-election to the U.S. Senate, setting off a political chain reaction the effects of which are still in progress.

In a statement released June 22, Rubio acknowledged that going back on his pledge would provide fodder for his political adversaries.

"I understand my opponents will try to use this decision to score points against me," he said. "Have at it."

Rubio said he was motivated to enter the U.S. Senate race just two days before the candidate filing deadline because of the senate's key role in serving as a check and balance on the power of the president. And in his announcement, the senator stressed he had concerns about both a Hillary Clinton and a Donald Trump presidency.

"No matter who is elected president, there is reason for worry," Rubio said. "With Hillary Clinton, we would have four more years of the same failed economic policies that have left us with a stagnant economy."

Rubio also charged that Clinton's "failed foreign policy" allowed radical Islam to spread unchecked and that a Clinton presidency would ignore congressional oversight.

As for Trump, Rubio noted that the two candidates often sparred during the presidential primaries. "(Trump's) positions on many key issues are still unknown," Rubio said, "and some of his statements, especially about women and minorities, I find not just offensive but unacceptable."

Were he to return to the U.S. Senate, Rubio said, he would be in a position to provide oversight of the next president and potentially tip the balance of political power in Washington.

"The control of the Senate may very well come down to the race in Florida," he said. "That means the future of the

Supreme Court will be determined by the Florida Senate seat...the stakes for our nation could not be any higher."

Political dominoes

Rubio's decision to seek re-election had immediate political repercussions. Within hours of Rubio's announcement, U.S. Rep. Ron DeSantis – who had been campaigning for Rubio's senate seat – announced that he would instead seek re-election to his current role representing Florida's 6th congressional district.

"In light of the Rubio development, I can best advance the cause (of limited government) by running for re-election to the U.S. House, where I can continue protecting taxpayers, promoting economic growth, helping our veterans and supporting our military," he said.

Republican contender Lt. Gov. Carlos Lopez-Cantera also withdrew from the race, voicing his support for Rubio's reelection bid.

"Florida needs a principled conservative leader now more than ever, and that is what Marco has been and will continue to be," Lopez-Cantera said in a statement, adding that he would be "continuing my service as Florida's lieutenant governor with Gov. Scott focusing on Florida."

Prior to Rubio's re-entry into the U.S. Senate race, the contest was already crowded with candidates. On the Democratic side, both U.S. Rep. Patrick Murphy and U.S. Rep. Alan Grayson were seeking the nomination in a field that also includes Pam Keith, Reginald Luster and Roque De La Fuente. Currently, the Republican slate now includes Rubio, Todd Wilcox, Ernie Rivera, Carlos Beruff, Dwight Mark Anthony Young and write-in candidate Howard Knepper. U.S. Rep. David Jolly and Ilya Katz previously withdrew from the race.

In addition, a number of third-party and no party affiliation candidates are seeking the seat, including Independents Tony Khoury, Basil Dalack, Bruce Nathan and Steven Machat; Libertarians Augustus Sol Invictus and Paul Stanton;

and write-in candidates Bradley Patrick, Jon Friend, Angela Marie Walls-Windhauser, Robert Samuel Kaplan and Charles Tolbert.

The primary election for the U.S. Senate seat is Aug. 30, with the general election to be held Nov. 8.

Congressional races

Rubio's announcement and DeSantis's subsequent re-entry into the congressional election has impacted that race as well, with candidate Brandon Patty withdrawing from the race. As of press time, candidates for the seat included DeSantis, G.G. Galloway and Fred Costello on the Republican side and Democrats William McCullough, Jay McGovern, George Pappas and Dwayne Taylor.

Noting that DeSantis, a Ponte Vedra Beach resident, no longer lives in the 6th congressional district – redistricting moved part of Ponte Vedra into the 4th district – Costello said DeSantis' entry into the race does not change his plans.

"I entered the (race) to serve my community and to run for America's future," he said, "not as a stepping stone for higher office."

According to St. Johns County Super-

visor of Elections Vicky Oakes, congressional candidates are not required to live in the district they represent, as federal offices are not subject to Florida statutes.

In the newly redrawn 4th congressional district race, candidates include Republicans John Rutherford, Bill McClure, Lake Ray, Hans Tanzler III, Stephen Kaufman, Edward Malin and Deborah Katz Pueschel. Julia Fletcher announced her withdrawal from the race last week.

You were born in China. How did you come to live in America?

The person who opened the door for me was my stepfather, Jim. My mom moved to this country when she married Jim in 2006. Living on the other side of the world from my mom was extremely difficult. That's why Jim decided to help me apply for my immigration visa in 2007. It took two years for my visa to get approved by the U.S. government, and these were probably the longest two years in my life.

My hometown, Suzhou, has more than 2,500 years of history. Although I am now officially a U.S. citizen, I am proud of my cultural background and the traditional values that helped shape me into who I am today.

I call Daytona Beach my "hometown" in the U.S. because it was the very first place that I lived and the place I started my second life at the age of 21. After a year and a half, I transferred from Daytona State College to the University of Florida in Gainesville. I've spent the past three years living in the Jacksonville area, a place I call my new home.

What brought you to Ponte Vedra Beach?

I love driving back home every day and entering this island of peace and relaxation. It's a different world from the city – it's my daily getaway. I moved into my condo at the start of 2015 and have been in love with this area ever since.

When did you decide to become an American citizen?

I always knew that I wanted to become a U.S. citizen, but the process required I live in the country for at least five years. I hit my five-year mark at the end of 2014, and I started the application process in September 2015. It just made perfect sense to me, as I know this is the country I will spend the rest of my life in.

What is involved in the citizenship process?

The entire process includes the application for naturalization, biometric appointment – where the government collected my fingerprints – in-person interview and concluded with the oath ceremony. From the beginning to the end, it took about six months. During the interview, I also had to pass the naturalization test, which includes an English and a civics portion. During my interview with the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services, I received an approval letter on the spot. It wasn't until I saw my naturalization ceremony notice, however, that I started sharing the exciting news with my friends.

What was the citizenship ceremony like?

It took place at the Bryan Simpson U.S. Courthouse located on Hogan Street, which is only one block away from the Dalton office. Three of my best friends joined me at the ceremony. April 28 will be forever marked as one of the most important days in my life! It's hard to describe. A lot of feelings and emotions went into that morning. My stepfather passed away in April this year, and I wish he could have been there to witness that special moment – the moment that he created for me in the first place. But I knew he was there spiritually, and he was proud.

The room was full of Americans-to-be who came from across the world. That was the moment it reminded me once again how wonderful this country is and what a life-changing opportunity this land has offered to every single one of us. We went through a final round of verification before taking the Oath of Allegiance and receiving the naturalization certificate.

My day became even more special when I went back to the office. Jim Dalton, CEO of the Dalton Agency, bought everyone an American flag t-shirt as a group celebration for me. My colleagues also decorated my work station with everything red, white and blue. I couldn't be more thankful for my work family!



When children battling life-threatening illnesses think of what their dream wish would be, often it's a trip to Disney World, a cruise or some other destination vacation.

But what 3-year-old Ponte Vedra resident Rue Andeer dreamed of most was a puppy - and a puppy is exactly what she got. A 16-week old female Bernese mountain dog and poodle mix or "bernedoodle" - named Bolt was presented to Rue during a surprise party thrown in her honor June 24 at the Dreams Come True offices in Jacksonville. In addition to her father Eric, mother Casey and 5-year-old older brother Bode, the party was attended by friends and Dreams Come True staff and supporters.

Told she was going to a princess party, Rue dressed the part, donning a pink skirt, Disney's "Frozen" t-shirt and tiara. The party room was decorated to the hilt, adorned with pink and purple tablecloths, balloons, "Frozen" party favors - even "Frozen"-themed confetti and life-sized cutouts of the "Frozen" movie characters Elsa, Anna and Olaf.

Leading up to the surprise reveal, Rue was first given a number of gifts, including The Usborne "Write Your Own Story Book," a Build-A-Bear Workshop puppy stuffed animal with a princess shirt, a Dreams Come True backpack and a dream wand.

A dog was always something at the forefront of her daughter's wishes, Casey Andeer said. Rue's parents toyed with the idea of a Taylor Swift concert, Disney World or "Frozen" on Broadway as possible dreams, but it was always dog first, ahead of the other dreams

"I was at the point where I would get her an elephant if she wanted an elephant," she said. "She's been through so much and this is going to get her through the rest of treatment."

Rue was diagnosed with acute lymphoblastic leukemia in October 2015 and is on track to complete her treatment within the next two years. Rue was referred to Dreams Come True in November 2015 by Nemours Children's Specialty Care, one of Dreams Come True's referring partners.

"How I look at (Dreams Come True) now is they're a teammate and they've done so much stuff that just brightened her days," Andeer said. "They are such an amazing organization that I want to be a part of forever."







Ponte Vedra: A popular place to do business

Whether you live in Ponte Vedra Beach or in Nocatee, you've likely noticed new restaurants like Trasca & Co. Eatery, Flavor Palette and Pieology providing consumers more choices to satisfy their culinary cravings. The growing menu of eateries is a trend indicative of growth throughout Ponte Vedra and Northeast St. Johns County. What's more, these new business options are not limited to just the retail and hospitality industries.

International Management Company (IMC) recently broke ground on a new 60,000 square-foot speculative office building in Nocatee. Chase or VyStar members can now visit their banks without leaving the beach. Companies like Vacation Pros are expanding their national headquarters in Ponte Vedra, while commercial spaces like Sawgrass Village are revitalizing their properties, bringing new life to area institutions like Aqua Grill.

It's not hard to understand why new businesses are popping up in Ponte Vedra. According to 2014 census data, the average median income for households in the growing community is nearly \$82,000 annually - more than 50 percent higher than the national average. With a highly desirable geographic location and a famously successful school district, St. Johns County is enjoying rapid growth, which is largely concentrated in the northern area including Nocatee and Ponte Vedra. In fact. 2015 U.S. Census data estimated 19.3 percent growth for St. Johns County compared to 7.8 percent statewide and 4.1 percent nationally over 2010.

Many of the newest business proprietors, however, don't cite numbers when asked what prompted them to open their businesses in Ponte Vedra.

"No other location was considered - Ponte Vedra is my hometown, it is where I have raised my children," said Jay Griffin, who in July will celebrate one year in business at A1A Pharmacy. "I wanted A1A Pharmacy to be modeled after the hometown pharmacy I knew as a child. It was a locally owned business that knew your name and took care of your

PGA Tour professional and entrepreneur Graeme McDowell also cited a personal connection as to why he chose to open his restaurant, Nona Blue - opening this summer in Ponte Vedra.

'My family and I love spending time in Ponte Vedra when I compete at THE PLAYERS," McDowell said. "I'm thrilled to expand Nona Blue to

such a beautiful city with so much golf heritage. We considered many options for our second location, but I can't think of a better place to bring our restaurant."

Kurt and Carla Miles grew up on the eastern shores of Virginia and Maryland, but referred to the "hometown feel" they experienced after moving here that helped them decide to open the Mainstream Boutique at 880 A1A N.

"Business is going well, meeting new people each day," Carla Miles said, "and I feel truly blessed to have the opportunity to connect with such fabulous people in the community."

Clearly, however, entrepreneurs are not deciding to open their businesses in northeast St. Johns based purely on sentiment.

"We feel that Nocatee is the most attractive submarket in North Florida for expanding national business," Lou Nutter, senior vice president at CBRE, said in a news release referring to the IMC office building currently under construction there.

IMC Vice President Raja Saoud agreed. In an article published in the St. Augustine Record, Saoud noted, "Whenever you have one of the largest, quickest growing communities in the United States, you're in the right place."

While Saoud hopes office space will be in high demand, Gary Hallett, owner of Gateway Business

Advisors, believes entrepreneurs are actively seeking opportunities in the

"Currently, there is a high demand for quality businesses priced between \$500,000 and \$5,000,000," Hallett said. "Business owners who are taking the time to properly prepare for their exit are being rewarded at the closing table."

Sectors in high demand, he added, are manufacturing, consumer/retail goods and business services.

Collaboration critical to elevating small businesses, Ross tells St. Johns Chamber

National Entrepreneur Center President Jerry Ross shared his thoughts on fostering entrepreneurship at the St. Johns County Chamber of Commerce's annual breakfast, held March 4 at the Renaissance World Golf Village Resort.

Addressing the several hundred local business and community leaders in attendance, Ross noted that 99 percent of all U.S. businesses have fewer than 100 employees.

"We're a small business country," he said.
"So anything we can do to move small businesses to the next level is critical to strengthening communities."

The key to reaching that next level, Ross said, is collaboration. Ross pointed to the St. Johns County Chamber's recent initiatives – including merging with the Ponte Vedra Beach chamber, moving to new offices, increasing communication and government advocacy efforts, and implementing a three-year strategic plan – as examples of how businesses can embrace the unity of purpose that transforms "cooperation" into "collaboration."

He also encouraged chamber members to collaborate with one another, sharing their successes and their setbacks so that others may benefit from the lessons they've learned.

"There are people in this room who have already gone through what you're going through right now," Ross said. "Business is not a solo sport. It's a team sport, and you can't play it alone."

Etiquette expert: Follow tips for perfect summer playdate

The lazy, hazy days of summer have officially arrived, and so has one of our biggest tasks: keeping the kids safe and entertained all summer! How many times do we hear those dreaded words, "Mom I'm so bored!"

along the way, and we made our own entertainment all summer long. Simple, that was it.

Today our children are growing up in a much more complicated world. Parents and children carefully plan and orchestrate playdates as one form of entertainment. Now, as much as I think playdates can be very helpful in keeping our children busy, not all playdates are created equal! It's not the best feeling when you realize you have an unruly child in your house for the next two hours, or you get a report from another parent that your child wasn't on their best behavior.

Here are a few tips for having a "Playful Playdate"

Set a specific date and time: When setting your child's playdate, make it clear what time the playdate begins and when it ends! An hour or two at the most is more than enough time. Little ones can get tired of one another after a while.

Always plan a snack time: It energizes kids, who always love eating at someone else's house. Make sure you discuss any possible food allergies in advance. Snack

time is also a perfect time for them to show off their good manners.

Just add water: Summer days can be very hot, especially in Florida. If the kids are playing outdoors, make sure to have water toys to play with. There are plenty of fun water activities to do even if you don't have a pool.

Don't overschedule: The kids are kept on a rigid schedule all year long in school. The best playdates always seem to be the ones where they get to run around outside. Have water toys, bottles of bubbles, and a couple of big beach balls available. Trust me, they will figure out their own fun and games.

Give them space: As long as they're in a safe environment and near to you, it's not necessary to watch them like a hawk. Keep your ears open and check in on them every once in a while of course, buts it's so important for you to keep your distance so they can solve their own little tiffs. They will return to playing sooner when they realize you're not going to rescue them every time.

Reinforce good manners: Children are

not born with good manners – they have to learn them. And if we don't teach them, they can't learn them. Make sure kids know the magic words – please, thank you, excuse me and I'm sorry – and that they are always expected to be used. Whenever your child is being served food, they must know how to eat with good manners, including:

- No slurping or burping
- Remembering to use their napkin

Conclude with clean-up: Make sure everyone knows they must help clean up, putting away crafts, toys and games before their pick-up time.

Lastly, make sure your child knows to thank the host parent! After all, if they had a good time, they will be want to be invited back!

BEAM's Grace Garden brings fresh produce, peace to families in need

When the Beaches Emergency Assistance Ministry's (BEAM) Grace Garden was first envisioned three years ago, it came from humble beginnings.

More than 40 truckloads of dirt and sand, bundles of wood beams and a storage shed occupied the plot of land on Sixth Avenue. Seedlings overwhelmed the ministry's office space and not so much as a gate existed on the previously vacant lot.

Today, the garden is teeming with life. The 6,000 square-foot farm is home to more than 40 raised 4- by 12-foot beds that house flowering produce. Bell peppers, eggplants, strawberries and watermelons tumble out of their confines, and marigolds, sunflowers and zinnia beckon swallowtail butterflies and bees.

Aeroponic vertical growing towers and a 16- by 24-foot greenhouse offer shelter to seedlings, while an irrigated shed stocked with damp logs grows mushrooms. Just outside of the garden's gate are strategically planted wildflowers warding predatory insects away, as well as a growing patch of blueberries, figs and squash.

Located at BEAM's offices at 850 Sixth Ave. S. in Jacksonville Beach, Grace Garden is spearheaded by Director of Food Services Mary Ellen Waugh, who said the program's third year has been very successful. An estimated 24,000 people are now serviced through BEAM's food banks, and the team has set a goal of supply-

ing 750,000 pounds of produce by the end of the year. The garden produces a harvest every day, supplementing the adjacent food pantry's fruits and vegetables.

"We try to address healthy eating by supplementing the produce in the food pantry," Waugh said. "Often times, low-income families fall at the lowest chain of a healthy diet. Many experience health issues because they don't have the means to eat fresh, healthy food. So we want to create a place for people in crisis." BEAM's food pantry is distinguished by the help offered by the Grace Garden, as most food pantries struggle to obtain fresh fruits, vegetables and herbs. In addition to the produce supplied by the garden, families have options in BEAM's food pantry minimarket, where they can select foods and necessities.

Waugh said the garden is supplied with seeds from Home Depot, packets of which line the walls inside of her office like a stockroom. Grace Garden's harvests are plentiful, as each seed packet fills an entire 12-foot box, and many of the seeds are for "quick grow" vegetables and fruits to steadily supply the food pantry. The garden grows only seasonal produce, and this summer will be harvesting tomatoes, strawberries, watermelon, okra and green beans among several other fruits and vegetables.

"The idea is to offer low-income families many more options while still addressing their needs," Waugh said. "In the pantry, we arrange things based on need and nutritional value while bringing the items to eye-level and making them accessible to everyone."

For Waugh, however, it's about more than just vegetables.

"The Grace Garden is beneficial in more than one way," she said. "It's about peace, activity and oneness with the earth and with others. Planting a garden is believing in the future."



Grace Garden mission depends on volunteers

In keeping with BEAM's mission, the garden and pantry are driven by the support of community members, churches, clubs and volunteers. Volunteer Coordinator Colleen Brennan said it's a feat to see a community so mobilized by a non-profit.

"I've been in nonprofits for 20 years and I have always scrambled for volunteers," she said. "Here, we receive applications constantly, and people tend to stay with us for years."

Considered a "best practice" model of food pantries, BEAM has partnered with the Brooks College of Health at the University of North Florida (UNF) to put undergrad and graduate students in contact with BEAM's clients. These students from the nutrition program help clients understand good nutrition and meal planning.

The Jacksonville Beach pantry also receives items from food recovery programs through Feeding Northeast Florida, with more than 20 grocery store pick-ups per week from businesses like Publix, Target and Native Sun in addition to donations from libraries and the Mayport commissary.

Ultimately, Waugh wants community members to understand the impact of their support and the need for the services that the BEAM and the Grace Garden provide to the Beaches community.

"When people come to (BEAM) for help, they're very often in distress – they need rent, utilities are due and they're in tears about making ends meet," she said. "A place like this, where people can get what they need and be at peace – is needed.

Proactive Retirement Planning

One of the questions I'm frequently asked is, when will the economy and stock market improve? Recent reports show our country's Gross Domes-

tic Product (GDP) grew at a measly 0.5 percent in the first quarter of the year and isn't expected to grow at much more than 2.0 percent for the remainder of the year. Exports have slowed as both Europe and Asia are struggling financially at the moment. The only bright spot has been the jobs report, which continues to show jobs being added every month and unemployment at low levels. Keep in mind, the

reported low unemployment rate can be somewhat deceptive, as many have simply dropped out of the job market altogether.

Slow-growth economic trends have and will continue to affect the stock market growth and will in all probability cause the Federal Reserve to be very cautious in raising interest rates, which will continue to dampen bond returns and interest on savings. If this situation continues for a period of time, both those saving for retirement and those in retirement could be significantly affected, as their savings and investments could earn far less than they were expecting. With some 80 million Baby Boomers coming into retirement, the timing is troubling for many.

Before concluding that there is no hope, let me suggest several things you can do:

Have a plan: Having a plan can make the differ-

ence between success and failure.

Diversify your investments: Putting all your eggs in one basket never makes great sense and it is particularly dangerous in tough times.

Minimize downside risk: No one ever likes to lose money but most people accept that investing involves risk. In a low-return environment, however, the time it takes to recover a loss is much longer than in more normal times; that makes a downturn much more damaging to your long-term stability.

Be careful of the set-it-and-forget-it solutions being touted today. Don't ignore the need to be proactive. Know your options and take charge of




