

Taxpayer guide to county finances introduced

St. Johns County Clerk of the Circuit Court and Comptroller Brandon J. Patty has presented the second edition of the award-winning Popular Annual Financial Report (PAFR), "Tracking Your Tax Dollars: A Guide to St. Johns County's Finances," to the Board of County Commissioners.

The report features key highlights from the lengthier Annual Comprehensive Financial Report (ACFR), a yearly accounting of the county's finances and budget. Designed to be straightforward and reader-friendly, the PAFR illustrates St. Johns County's financial picture for fiscal year 2020-21 and includes how residents' tax dollars are collected, spent and invested.

The 20-page booklet also offers economic information and noteworthy trends on demographics, housing, taxes and more.

The PAFR is accessible online at stjohn-sclerk.com/pafr. Printed copies will be available in mid-October by request at the St. Johns County Clerk of the Circuit Court and Comptroller, Richard O. Watson Judicial Center, 4010 Lewis Speedway, in St. Augustine.

The Annual Comprehensive Financial Report includes the financial statements for the Board of County Commissioners, Clerk of the Court, Property Appraiser, Sheriff, Supervisor of Elections and Tax Collector. The full report is available online at stjohnsclerk.com/county-annual-financial-report/.


Explore the beach

Whitehurst: No Plan B if surtax fails

On Nov. 8, St. Johns County voters will either approve or reject a proposed one-cent sales surtax designed to fund countywide public infrastructure and improvements.

At a Monday, Oct. 10, public meeting hosted by the St. Johns County Civic Roundtable, County Commissioner Christian Whitehurst described what is at stake.

In February, the county released a list of 34 capital projects that would require the surtax to get the necessary funding. The projects include road improvements, alternative transportation facilities, infrastructure for law enforcement, emergency services, public parks and recreation facilities, libraries, storm water management and coastal erosion management.

Ponte Vedra area projects include: Mickler Road, roundabout to A1A (cost: \$14 million); Palm Valley Road, Roscoe Road to the roundabout (cost: \$15 million); Pine Island Road at U.S. 1, signalization (cost: \$1.5 million), Nocatee Park (cost: \$16 million) and Nocatee Library (cost: \$12 million).

The total cost of all the projects on the list comes to \$500 million.

Whitehurst said he has spoken with

county staff to resolve the gap between what is needed and available funding.

"I'm finding we just don't have the money to improve things that you are asking, demanding that I improve as your elected official," he said. "Out of a sense of pure frustration, and just the fact that the numbers don't work, I voted yes to put this on the ballot."

People have advocated for cuts to the budget and elimination of waste, though they generally do not cite where they believe the cuts should be made.

Whitehurst said, as a business owner, "I know how to cut waste. I've looked at it. I can't find the waste."

He cited some reasons that the county is experiencing the funding deficit.

In response to the 2008 recession, the state mandated a rollback in property taxes by 1 mill, which cost the county \$57.1 million. At the same time, the Board of County Commissioners added \$25,000 to the Homestead Exemption, which removed \$188 million from the county budgets between 2008 and 2021. Also, the recession cost the county another \$79 million due to a devaluation of property.

Then, in 2011, the commission, hoping to spur growth, reduced impact fees on residential development by 25%. In 2018,



St. Johns County Commissioner Christian Whitehurst speaks about the proposed one-cent sales surtax during a public meeting Monday, Oct. 10.


the county raised impact fees to their statutory maximum, but these fees continue to be insufficient due to the effects of inflation. A residential development may agree to fund a road widening at the current cost, but if the project doesn't happen for several years, that widening will cost significantly more and the developer's portion of the funding is then insufficient.

Asked what happens if the referendum is rejected, Whitehurst said, "There is no Plan B. I'm not going to raise your

property taxes, which would be the only other option."

In fact the shortfall could simply grow more severe.

"This \$500 million list of needs will inevitably turn into a billion dollar list of needs and will turn into a \$1.5 billion — we're talking a decade, two decades down the road," Whitehurst said. "This list of needs will grow not only in the number of things that we have to improve but in the dollar amount as inflation does what inflation does."

After having a career as a hair stylist for more than 20 years, Tracie Rampley began her own custom hat company in 2013, called Embellished Designs. She puts her own personal touch into each hat and takes pride in the fact that no hat is ever the same. She is also very active in the community and tries to give back every chance she gets ever since moving to Ponte Vedra Beach in 2011.

As told to Anthony Richards

Tell us a little about yourself and your background.

I've lived in Ponte Vedra Beach since 2011 and in 2013 I started my custom hat business Embellished Designs and have really grown it from the ground up.

I'm as country as cornbread having grown up on a farm 30 miles south of Chattanooga, Tennessee, in Northwest Georgia.

I definitely came from a humble beginning and I have always had a passion for helping others. My mom was a single parent, and we always gave back any way we could.

What led you to designing hats?

I was a hair stylist for over 20 years before getting into hats.

It all started when somebody came up to me at the Ponte Vedra Garden Club and asked who did my hat. I told her that I made it myself and the next thing I knew I was being asked by multiple people if I could make one for them.

The business had grown to the point where I was making 48 hats within a six-month span prior to COVID-19.

I would always make my own style, so I knew I had a designer's eye. My hats are made out of my home.

Is there a certain type of hat you specialize in?

I do custom only at this point and they are all originals. I don't make any hats look the same.

You can't find me at a store or online. It is as grass-roots an operation as it gets.

Prior to making a hat for someone it is important for me to see the outfit they plan to wear with the hat and give advice on what would be best in a hat to compliment that look.

It is so important because I'm all about flow from your head to your toes. I'll tell them to get what they want to wear, and we'll build the hat around that.

People think that they can't wear a big hat, but that's not the case. Anyone can wear any sized hat as long as it fits on their head. If you can dream it, then I can create it.

It's about a two-three-week turnaround time to complete a hat and nobody touches the hats throughout the process but me.

Kentucky Derby parties are a busy time for hat orders, but I also do weddings and themed parties.

What do you enjoy most about your job?

I still get cold chills each time when they try a hat on for the first time. I take pride in my hats and in the people that wear them.

If they are going to wear it to a charitable event, one of the things I'll do is give 10% of the profit from the hat's sale to that specific charity. I will also donate hats to be auctioned offer at certain charity events.

What are some of the other ways you are involved within the community?

I have always tried to help young people understand that their mistakes do not define them. I have mentored young women and inner-city kids and am an angel ambassador with Angels and Doves Anti-bullying.

I have also been a voice against domestic violence and

love to go on Christmas day and feed the less fortunate and spend my time with other who don't have a lot.

I've been focusing a lot on the younger generation of late.

What advice would you give to the next generation of fashion designers?

I was a tomboy growing up and spent a lot of time driving motorcycles and dirt bikes. One day in middle school I started to get intrigued by fashion and it has been a love of mine ever since.

I would encourage anyone who has an interest in fashion that if you have a thought, to go with it and go buy


some material to make it happen and remember to never give up.

After decade of asking, Palm Valley sidewalk plan appears in place

Persistence has paid off for the Palm Valley Community Association in its quest to get a more cohesive sidewalk plan in place.

Jayne Evans, director of the Palm Valley Community Association, was one of the guest speakers during the Ponte Vedra Beaches Coalition meeting Oct. 10.

She updated those in attendance regarding the Palm Valley sidewalk plans and where they are in the process

According to Evans, the path for a much-needed sidewalk project down Palm Valley Road has been a minding one and has been something residents have been pushing for a decade.

However, now is the closest they have ever been to seeing a sidewalk project be implemented for the area.

"The objective of the sidewalk from the very beginning has been to improve road safety for everyone involved," Evans said. "The plan is to build a 'continuous' sidewalk on the westside of Palm Valley Road.

According to Evans, the word "continuous" is key and has been used as a sticking point throughout the St. Johns County Commission's discussion process.

As the plan, will look to connect where existing sidewalks end with the new sidewalk project, so that a

continuous sidewalk will stretch once completed.

"This is how modern communities are built," Evans said. "We know how hard it can be to retro fit older communities, but it is something that needs to be done."

The additional sidewalks will not only benefit those who walk along them, but it will also make the roadways safer for vehicle drivers as well.

In April, the project got a big boost after awarded \$800,000 in state funding thanks to the help of Rep.

Cyndi Stevenson's representation in the state legislature.

"That money was what eventually secured the project," Evans said.

The county has agreed to offer up \$1.35 million, and Evans expects them to begin putting out proposals for bids on the project later this month.

The sidewalk section between Landrum Lane and Canal Street had a head start in the past, but phase 2 will include Canal Street all the way north where the PGA Tour sidewalk ends.

Evans hopes that by fall 2023 there will be shovels in the ground and construction of the project will be fully underway.

The plan for the project is constantly changing, especially when it comes to finding better ways to upgrade the safety aspect of things.

That includes not just building a sidewalk, but also considering all of the other safety concerns that remain even by helping eliminate some of them with the sidewalk

"We are still looking into safe ways to cross from the west and east sides of the street, because there are some portions of sidewalks on the other side as well," Evans said

SBA loans could help hurricane survivors

FEMA may refer survivors of Hurricane Ian to the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) with information on how to apply for a disaster loan. Homeowners, renters, business owners and certain nonprofits may be eligible. It's important to submit the loan application as soon as possible.

If your application is approved, you are not obligated to accept an SBA loan but failure to return the application may disqualify you from other possible financial assistance from FEMA and State of

SBA disaster loans are the largest source of federal disaster recovery funds for survivors. SBA offers long-term, low-



interest disaster loans to businesses of all sizes, private nonprofit organizations, homeowners and renters.

SBA disaster loans cover losses not fully compensated by insurance or other resources. Survivors should not wait for an insurance settlement before submitting an SBA loan application. They may discover they were underinsured for the deductible, labor and materials required to repair or replace their home.

People may apply online using the Electronic Loan Application (ELA) via the SBA's secure website at disaster-loanassistance.sba.gov or by visiting a Disaster Recovery Center. Paper applications may be requested by calling the SBA Customer Service Center at 800-659-2955. Those who are deaf, hard of hearing or have a speech disability may dial 7-1-1 to access telecommunications relay services or send an email to disastercustomerservice@sba.gov. There is no cost to apply for an SBA disaster loan.

SBA disaster loan specialists are available to speak with homeowners and renters at all Florida Disaster Recovery Centers, which are open seven days a week from 9 a.m. until 6 p.m.


Homeowners may be eligible for a disaster loan up to \$200,000 for primary residence structural repairs or rebuilding.

SBA may also be able to help homeowners and renters with up to \$40,000 to replace important personal property, including automobiles damaged or destroyed in the disaster.




Several local schools were represented from St. John's and Duval counties, including local colleges, high schools, middle schools and elementary schools, too.



Hamer has always taken it upon her-


self to represent in the community as a female business owner and she does have a daughter herself.

FALL COLORS!

As the temperatures drop to the low 80s (or maybe even 70s!), we start to feel hints of fall in our Northeast Florida home! It is cooling off enough to return to the garden, but what is best to

plant now for seasonal color?

Many flowers that wilt in the summer heat enjoy the cooler temperatures of Florida's fall and winter. Although annuals need replanting every season, they show off vibrant colors throughout a landscape. Consider adding celosia, dianthus, Dusty Miller, marigolds, pansies, petunias, snapdragons and violas to your garden and/or containers now for color in the coming months. There are



also perennials that will bloom now and return again next fall. In our area, look for firespike, geraniums, mums, pentas and salvia.

Shrubs and other plants can also be added to your landscape alongside these flowers. Plants that feature colorful foliage include crotons and loropetalum. Shrubbery can provide color and fill in throughout your yard. Holly and other shrubs that produce berries attract birds looking for food as they migrate through

our area. These berries also remind us that the holidays are right around the

Although Florida may not see the changing fall leaves of trees in cooler climates, there are trees that provide seasonal color in our area. Now is a good time to plant the trees that you have been considering for your landscape. Ideas for trees that feature fall color include bottlebrush, cypress and maple.

When you prepare your garden for new fall planting, be sure to enrich the soil with organic matter. This step allows plants to find and retain nutrients that help them grow and produce beautiful blooms. If desired, add a slow-release fertilizer or organic compost to support

your new plants. And, as always, don't forget to water regularly!

The coming months are the dryer season in our area, so you will need to maintain moisture throughout your gardens.

"Our overarching theme throughout our program is that we are housing focused," Correale said. "We don't want you to have to stay with us. The 'homeward bound' program is all about giving them the tools to succeed."

Pumpkin patch pops up at Lord of Life Lutheran Church

The charming Great Pumpkin Patch has returned to Lord of Life Lutheran Church, covering nearly an acre of the front lawn with pumpkins for the month.

Boy Scouts and other volunteers helped unload the pumpkins and boxes of gourds on Friday, Oct. 7, and were ready to start selling immediately. The patch will run every day until Oct. 31. Hours of operation will be weekdays from 1 p.m. to dusk; Saturdays from 9 a.m. to dusk and Sundays from 11 a.m. to dusk.

Pink Ribbon Jax creates awareness, relief with mammogram initiative



Pink Ribbon Jax continues to do its part as a nonprofit organization to not only raise money to help people get checked for breast cancer, but also to raise awareness about it.

Every month is an important time to shed light on these issues, but with October's designation as Breast Cancer Awareness Month, they seek to use the platform as another opportunity to spread the word about what all they are striving to do.

The group is an all-volunteer outfit and all the money they raise is intended to stay in Jacksonville to help both women and men in their fight with breast cancer.

According to Pink Ribbon Jax committee chair Marica Pendjer, there are

men who get breast cancer and that is not something that should be forgotten.

"That's why I call them our 'warriors in pink,' because it includes both men and women," Pendjer said. "If you have the tissue, you can get the disease."

The focus of the organization in recent years has honed in on helping those in the community who can not afford to get tested for breast cancer.

That is why most of the funds raised goes towards purchasing mammograms for people who do not have the means to do so through a partnership with Baptist Health and Mayo Clinic of Jacksonville.

"If it comes down to someone having to decide whether to feed their family or get a mammogram, we want the burden of that choice to not have to be made," Pendjer said. "This is one of those cancers that we can detect, and we believe everyone should have that option."


Last year, Pink Ribbon Jax raised more than \$2.5 million and according to Pendjer, all of the money stayed in the local community.

"I think that really resonates with the people," Pendjer said.

Through their efforts they were able to offer 1,500 free mammograms for people in need last year.

"That's a lot of lives and families being touched, because it's not just a sole battle," Pendjer said. "One in eight

women will get breast cancer during their lifetime."

Girls basketball clinic focuses on mentorship, fundamentals

Jessica Spencer-Gardner has yet to coach her first game as the head girls basketball coach at Ponte Vedra High, but she has already done her best to establish what she hopes is a lasting mark.

Ponte Vedra High hosted a girls basketball clinic Oct. 8 in the school's gym. The clinic was broken up into two segments with the morning session consisting of middle school-aged girls and the afternoon session focusing on younger ages.

"I just see a need for girls basketball opportunities in our area," Spencer-Gardner said. "That's why we wanted to really build up the younger girls out there in our community. My goal is to use basketball to help build the next generation of strong and confident female leaders."

Not only did the clinic concentrate on growing the love of the game among the community's youth, but it also gave members on the current high school squad the chance to teach and interact with those future Sharks.

According to Spencer-Gardner, there was so much to be gained from the day by everyone taking part.

"The Ponte Vedra High basketball players are phenomenal leaders and players, so to put them in position to be role models for the younger generation is great," Spencer-Gardner said. "This game has given me so much and it's full of life lessons to be learned."

The message throughout the clinic was clear that although basketball was the reason they were all there, it was about much more than just the game.

"When you're face-to-face with those little girls, you realize the impact you can

have on their lives," Spencer-Gardner said.

Each player in the high school program, both varsity and junior varsity, were on hand and serving as an instructor at any of the various skill stations set up around the gym.

Also helping was Charlsea Clark, who had spent years as a coach at the high school and college levels, most recently last year as an assistant coach for the University of North Florida women's basketball program.

Not only did Clark offer up her expertise and tips as an instructor, but she also provided some word of inspiration and advice for the girls during a portion of the clinic

Clark emphasized the importance of having a relentless work ethic and approaching the game with respect and a selfless attitude.

"I've really been focusing on leadership with my girls and what it means to be a leader," Spencer-Gardner said. "This gives them an opportunity to be in

Spencer-Garner took over as head coach of the Sharks in April and since then she has experienced a smooth transition as she's worked on building her relationships with her players.

"I'm a relationship-driven coach, so I told the girls from day one that I will be there for them 100%," Spencer-Gardner said. "We've done a lot of team bonding early on and I've had a blast with them. They are just such a great group of girls."

Although the season has not gone as the Panthers would have hoped to this point with a record of 1-6 and having lost their share of close contests.


However, according to head coach Collin Drafts, Friday's matchup marks a clean slate for the Panthers. as they begin essentially a "new season."

The Sharks (3-3) have showed plenty of both with late drives by the offense in clutch moments in the last two games.

That is a good sign moving forward, as the offense has proven not to be fazed during the pressure-packed points of a game.

A large reason for that continues to be the play of quarterback Ben Burk, who has taken complete command of the offense since the bye week and he will look to continue that progression against the Celtics.


