# **Arrest warrant issued** in stabbing case

An arrest warrant was issued Monday for a Ponte Vedra Beach man in relation to multiple stabbings on Saturday, June 3, in the parking lot of Mr. Chubby's Wings, 150 Valley Circle, Ponte Vedra Beach.

Spencer Ross Pearson, 18, is facing charges of two counts of attempted murder and aggravated battery with a deadly weapon causing permanent disability. Pearson is currently hospitalized with injuries sustained in the incident.

According to the St. Johns County Sheriff's Office, a 17-year-old girl and her mother had met friends at the restaurant but left once they saw Pearson seated at a nearby table. As they were walking toward their vehicle about 20 seconds after they had left, Pearson was seen charging them.


In a sworn, recorded statement, one of the victims told authorities that Pearson held the girl down with one arm and stabbed her about 15 times. The girl's mother tried to intervene and was stabbed by the defendant in her forehead and leg, according to the Sheriff's Office report.

A bystander ran to assist and dislodged the defendant but was also stabbed.

According to the report, Pearson then sliced his own throat several times while telling witnesses he was attempting to kill himself.

Authorities began receiving numerous 911 calls at about 4:30 p.m. Sheriff's deputies and St. Johns County Fire Rescue responded.

Two of the victims and the defendant remain hospitalized.

Nease NJROTC cadets participate in local, regional and national competitions


for drill teams, air rifle/marksmanship, CyberPatriot, drone and orienteering.

# As told to Shaun Ryan

# Tell me about your most recent books.

Since "The Consort Conspiracy," I've had three more books. The second one turned out to be "On Deadly Grounds." The first two were murder mysteries.

The third one, "The Road Remembered," is a story of how love and humanity triumphed amid the atrocities of World War II. We all know the stories of World War II; in this book, you will meet the people who lived them.

# That book was based in part on your father's experiences, but also the lives of other real people.

My dad had been a part of the 89th Infantry Division. I thought: I have so many questions, but he's gone. So, I did research on the internet about the 89th Infantry Division to see if I could find any other soldiers who were still alive. And I found one on Austin, Texas — then I found his obituary.

But in the obituary, they mentioned a surviving twin brother. I looked him up and found a name and phone

# What happened then?

We had a wonderful conversation. We communicated several times. I was able to actually fly out to Austin, and I spent a day talking to him. I got his story and his twin brother's story.

So, I incorporated my dad's story. I incorporated the twins' story. Then, people started sending me names of World War II veterans. I ended up interviewing about

I included all of that in the third book, which I called "The Road Remembered."

My main character, Sam, who had a lot of the experiences my dad had, is telling all of these stories to his daughter, who accompanies him to the 70th anniversary of the war. That's how I did the modern day part of the story — and the one that was 70 years old.

# Tell me about the book that followed.

In the latest book called "The Road Renounced," I explore a lot more of Sam's family and early life. That takes place primarily during World War I, so it's actually a prequel to book number three.

'The Road Renounced" is a World War I tale of one soldier's triumphs and tragedies as told by the woman who loves him.

Sam shows up in the book but as a child. His father is Buzz. The story is Buzz's story and Sam's mother Maude's story.

That one came out in December/January.

# How long does it take to write a book?

That depends. I worked on my first book for 20 years before it was actually published. "The Road Remembered" probably took about two years. "The Road Renounced" was under a year, because I already knew the whole story.

# How can people get a copy of your books?

I always invite people to come to my website: www. kayedschmitzauthor.com. I have a store on my website, so I can personalize the books to them or to someone they choose to order for.

The other thing I've done recently is bundle the four

books. To buy each book separately, it would be \$85. But I am bundling all four for \$70.

However, if people don't care to have them personalized, they're available from Amazon and Barnes & Noble.

# How do you develop story ideas?

The way I see it is: anything can be a storyline.

My husband and I will be watching television, and I'll say, "What if this happened?" And it will go from there. The ideas normally come in quicker than I can even write

For my first book, I got the idea from an old cemetery, reading an epitaph on an above-the-ground crypt from the

For the second book, I had visited this huge mansion just outside Los Angeles where a murder took place six months after the family had moved in. I took that story and moved it to North Carolina.

For the third book, I had my dad's map [following his travels in the war], and that gave me the idea for the

The fourth book just kind of came as the result of things I felt I had left unfinished in the third book.

I adore Kristin Hannah. I also really love Steve Berry. ... As a matter of fact, he spent three hours with me at his dining room table showing me how I could make my writing stronger, use fewer words and other things that I've incorporated into everything I do.

Who are some of your favorite authors?

I also love Karen White, who writes paranormal and ghost stories. I really like Dorothea Benton Frank. She wrote a series of what she called "low-country" stories that took place in South Carolina close to the ocean.

# Would you say these authors had an influence on your

Absolutely. Dorothea had an influence on my ability to write some of my characters almost girlfriend-style. Steve had an influence with helping me to build suspense and keep suspense going. Kristin Hannah, from her I got the idea that I needed to have a parallel character or parallel story that I would eventually bring together at the

# Investing: The importance of planning

In its 2019 Retirement Study, Wells Fargo found that investors with a planning mindset felt they had greater personal control over matters such as personal debt, investment performance, career, and their overall financial life. The planning mindset was defined according to four key components:

- 1. "I am able to work diligently toward a long-term goal."
- 2. "In the last six months, I have set and achieved a goal or set of goals to support my financial life."
- 3. "I prefer saving for retirement now to ensure I have a better life in retirement."
- 4. "It makes me feel better to have my finances planned out in the next 1-2

vears.

According to the study\*, approximately one-third of workers have the planning mindset. Those workers are nearly twice as satisfied with their overall financial life as those without a planning mindset, nearly twice as confident that they'll have enough money saved for retirement, and five times more likely to have a plan for dealing with the unexpected.

# Steps to becoming a better planner

The good news is that all investors have the ability to develop or strengthen planning skills that can help them improve their financial outlook.

The first step is to obtain general financial education, which could include

reading books or listening to podcasts on personal investment planning, taking a course online or at a local college, or talking with a financial advisor.

Next come the simple (although not always easy) steps to spend less and save more. Financial apps can help with tasks such as budgeting and tracking spending. Automated nudges — such as a yearly increase in the 401(k) savings rate — can help keep savings plans on track. Just remember that it can take time and practice to change financial habits. Beginning with smaller steps can reinforce the new habits and build confidence to move to the next level.

Then focus on developing a long-term investment plan, including contingency

plans to help deal with the unexpected. Tools such as vision boards — a collage of images that represent future desires — can help investors flesh out goals such as home ownership or retirement preferences. Once the basic plan is in place, continual updates allow investors to adapt to changes in the economy and their own circumstances. A plan should be documented and should be living and breathing — not something you create and forget. Life changes and your plan should keep pace.

With education and effort, investors can use a planning mindset to help achieve long-term financial health and the


To that will soon be added exercise equipment and two showers.



# Succulents

Summer is almost here, and it's getting hot! Succulents are a great choice for the warmest areas of your landscape. Now is a perfect time to create a succulent garden or planter that needs minimal attention!

Succulents love dry heat and very

little water. Sounds like the perfect plants, right?

These plants have evolved in climates that are almost unbearable, with rocky terrain and desert landscapes. They retain water in their leaves and stems and, therefore, only need to be watered occasionally. Due to their unique nature, they also can survive in winter single digit temperatures.

You can create a succulent garden in the ground, in a planter or even in a rock garden.

Some of the most popular varieties are cactus, sedum, purslane, agave, aloe, echeveria, and crassula.

Tips on creating a succulent planter:



**Succulent Planter** 

- Choose a shallow, wide planter with a drainage system. These plants do not like sitting in water.
- Look for a potting soil designed for succulents.
- When purchasing succulents, remember that some

# Veterans, unsung heroes recognized during D-Day remembrance

The We Can Be Heroes Foundation honored the veterans who served and sacrificed their lives during D-Day with its annual remembrance June 6 with a presentation at the Salem Centre Auditorium in Jacksonville.

John Connelly was one of the many veterans who attended the event on the night. He served during World War II as a pilot and was a prisoner of war, having spent time in two German prison camps after being captured during the war.

Also in attendance was Capt. Gregory Streeter who retired from the U.S. Navy and was the past commander general of the Naval Order of the United States.

Streeter has become a regular over the years at the D-Day banquet, and it's only fitting because not only is he a veteran, but he also was instrumental in helping get a monument built on the beaches of Normandy, France, that honors the heroic acts of the U.S. Navy on that fateful day.

According to Streeter, at the time when the monument was erected, there were various D-Day monuments around the area, but none commemorating the U.S. Navv.

There were many veterans that had hoped to make it on the night but were unable to due to health-related issues they are dealing with.



# NEFAR donation to support 'Living Shoreline Oyster Bar'

The Northeast Florida Association of Realtors (NE-FAR) Charitable Foundation joined the Northeast Florida Chapter of the Coastal Conservation Association (CCA) in donating more than \$27,000 to the University of North Florida Coastal and Marine Biology program to develop an experimental "Living Shoreline — Oyster Reef" project in the St. Johns River.

NEFAR donated \$17,568 to the project, which is designed to rebuild historic oyster populations, increase the habitat for oyster spat, reduce wave energy and shoreline erosion, improve water quality and increase local opportunities for fishing. CCA donated \$10,000.

"Realtors are committed to the sustainability of our natural resources," said 2023 NEFAR President Diana Galavis. "Improved water quality and protecting our waterways has been a NEFAR priority for many years. NEFAR is honored to partner on the living shoreline and oyster reef."

The project is intended to rebuild historic populations of Eastern oysters by providing a suitable habitat for oyster spat to settle and grow. The re-establishment of oyster reefs is expected to have a positive influence on reducing wave energy and associated shoreline erosion, which will

provide a greater protection to coastal properties.

Reef building is also predicted to have a positive effect on water quality because of the pollution-filtering capabilities of oysters. It is also anticipated to have a beneficial effect on local shellfish and fish populations by providing increased habitat, which in turn can improve local opportunities for recreation, such as fishing.

NEFAR's funds were in part generated from sponsorship proceeds derived from its annual Waterway's Clean-up Event that will take place this year from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m. July 8. NEFAR's annual Waterways Clean-up is part of Florida Realtors' monthlong, statewide Clean-up Florida Waters Initiative. It will be organized this year by the NEFAR Community Affairs Task Force under the direction of Margarita Diaz Cavanagh, Rae Laws and Mark Feagle.

Named the "NEFAR Oyster Bar," the project will consist of the construction and field deployment of 18-24 cement-based substrates known as "POSH" – pervious oyster shell habitat units – that are constructed of concrete and include small amounts of embedded oysters. NEFAR Realtors will assist with the construction of the POSH units later this year.

The POSH units will be placed at sites where historic oyster beds once were found within UNF's 1,050-acre property in the Atlantic Intracoastal Waterway (ICW), known as the William C. Webb Coastal Research Station.
